

# **Biblical Accounts of Angels**

### Messenger Angels

God created angels, who served as heavenly messengers to humans (Job 38:7; Colossians 1:16; Hebrews 1:14). In Hebrew and Greek, "angel" means "messenger." Two angels in human form rescued Lot and his family (Genesis 19:1–22). God's angel protected the Israelites as they fled Egypt (Exodus 14:19). The angel Gabriel informed the Virgin Mary that she would give birth to Jesus Christ (Luke 1:26–38). God's angels appeared to the shepherds at Jesus' birth (Luke 2:8–15) and the disciples at His tomb (John 20:12).

## Angels of War

"Fear not," Elisha told his servant when a Syrian army surrounded the city of Dothan. He further explained, "Those who are with us are more than those who are with them." Then Elisha prayed and asked the Lord to open his servant's eyes. In response, the Lord caused the young man to be able to see that "the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha," an angelic army surrounding them (2 Kings 6:16–17, TLV).

### **Angels of Destruction**

"He sent on them the fury of His anger—wrath and indignation and trouble—a band of evil angels" (Psalm 78:49).

## **Guardian Angels**

"For He will give His angels charge over you, to guard you in all your ways. Upon their hands they will lift you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone" (Psalm 91:11, 12).

## Does It Matter Whether or Not Angels Are Real?

God's angelic messengers heralded hope and salvation and relayed divine warnings. Our hope is in Jesus Christ, Who affirmed the existence of angels. We can't believe God's promises and disbelieve the existence of His angelic messengers who spoke to prophets and apostles on His behalf (e.g., Jacob, Daniel, Isaiah, John, Peter, and Paul). So, yes, it does matter that angels are real (Hebrews 13:2).
